LET'S TALK WITH KING SAMBA SPIRIT

THE SMALL THINGS THAT DESTROY GREAT RELATIONSHIPS

A man once complained that his marriage was falling apart. As we talked, I expected to hear about a major issue, perhaps unfaithfulness, financial problems, or constant fighting. Instead, he quietly said, *"We just stopped doing the little things."* That statement stayed with me.

The truth is, **many relationships do not collapse because of one big mistake. They slowly wear out because of the little things that are ignored day after day.**

Some of these little things include:

- Messages that are never replied to.
- Being online but ignoring your spouse's messages.
- Not appreciating your spouse's efforts, whether at home, at work, or even on social media.
- Finding it difficult to have a long conversation with your spouse, yet chatting happily with other people.
- Being kinder and more caring to others than to your own spouse.
- Sharing personal information with others that your spouse does not even know.
- Denying your spouse intimacy without genuine reasons.
- Neglecting romance until it gradually disappears.
- A phone call that is never returned.
- A "thank you" that is never said.
- An apology that pride refuses to offer.
- A conversation that is always postponed.
- A hug that is replaced with silence.

None of these may seem like a serious problem on their own. But when they become a habit, they gradually create distance between two people who once could not stay away from each other.

Love is not only expressed through expensive gifts or grand surprises. More often than not, it is found in the ordinary moments of life. Asking, "How was

your day?" Listening without interrupting. Sharing a laugh. Praying together. Appreciating the little efforts your spouse makes. These simple acts keep love alive.

Sadly, many people become more polite to strangers than they are to their own husbands or wives. We say "please" and "thank you" to people outside our homes, but speak carelessly to those we claim to love the most. That should never be so.

Another silent destroyer is **assuming that your partner already knows how you feel.** Appreciation should never be assumed. Kind words should never become old fashioned. Never get too comfortable to say, "I love you," "I'm proud of you," or "Thank you for all you do."

Every relationship will experience misunderstandings. That is part of life. The difference is how we handle them. A humble "I'm sorry" can prevent days of silence. A forgiving heart can stop bitterness from taking root. Peace is always more rewarding than winning an argument.

Strong marriages are not built by perfect people. **They are built by ordinary people who choose, every day, to be patient, kind, respectful, and forgiving, even when it is not easy.**

If your relationship is going to remain strong, do not wait until there is a major crisis before you begin to care. Pay attention to the little things today. They may seem small, but they often determine whether love grows stronger or slowly fades away.

Takeaway: Great relationships are not built by one big act of love. They are built by countless small acts of love, repeated consistently. Never underestimate the power of the little things. They can either destroy a relationship or make it beautiful for a lifetime.



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
